Complaint (C) (Violation Alleged)

# Initial Review (SSCO)

Threshold determination: jurisdiction and potential code violation alleged.

If no, stop.



# **Notice of Conduct** Conference (SSCO)

(Summons Letter) Sets conduct conference and briefly describes allegations

procedural violation has occurred. Conduct Available if Student believes a policy or process on hold pending resolution

**Procedural Review Complaint** 

#### Conduct Conference (SSCO/SCO)

- Explain conduct process, rights, and responsibilities
- Review complaint alleged violations
- Respondent provides their explanation



Additional Investigation (SSCO/SCO) (If necessary)



# Inconclusive Determination

- Insufficient information available to make a determination
- May be resumed if information becomes available



## Determination: Not Responsible

- Conduct Officer finds student not responsible for a conduct code violation
- Case dismissed



# Determination: Responsible

- Conduct Officer finds a violation is more likely than not to have occurred or student does not participate in conduct conference
- Determination and resolution/sanctions
- Student may accept or appeal the determination and/or sanctions

# Agreement of Accountability (SSCO/SCO)

- Student acknowledges responsibility and enters into an agreement about appropriate sanctions
- Not available in sexual misconduct/assault cases



### Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (BAP) Appeal (CRO)

- Available when sanction is: Suspension less than 10 days, College housing suspension/eviction, deferred action, or probation
- Conduct Review Officer holds informal hearing during which parties present witnesses and evidence
- Initial decision is issued within 10 calendar days from hearing



### Appeal (R or C)

Submitted in writing within 10 calendar days of receipt of determination or the determination becomes final



**BAP Administrative Review (Senior)** 

- Only allowed if new, previously unavailable, information is discovered, a procedural error that impacted the outcome occurred, or the student conduct official or conduct review officer is believed to have bias
- Senior college official considers written arguments of parties and issues a written decision within 20 days of the request



# Appeal Panel Hearing (SCAP)

- Available when sanction is Suspension is more than 10 days, expulsion, or referred by a student conduct review officer or senior college official
- 3 person panel consisting of one Student, Faculty, and Staff representative holds formal hearing during which parties present witnesses and evidence
- Student(s) may have an advisor present or be represented by an attorney at their
- Decision issued within 15 calendar days of hearing or submission of closing arguments

Sanctions Upheld



Sanctions Modified (decreased)

Sanctions Modified (increased)

Referred to Appeal Panel for Hearing





#### Request for Reconsideration (Senior)

- Must be received in writing within 5 days of receipt of determination or the determination is final
- Only allowed if new, previously unavailable information is discovered, a procedural error that impacted the outcome occurred, or the student conduct official is believed to have bias
